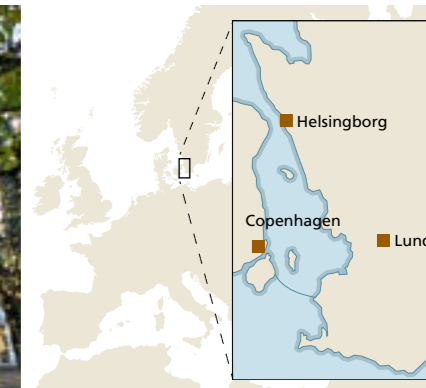

Course evaluations

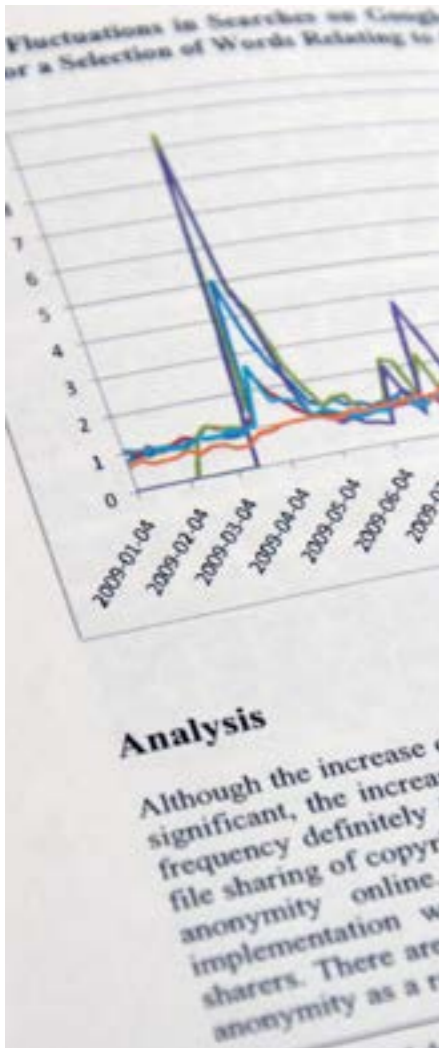
- develop the work with course evaluations to increase the efficiency in the pedagogical quality assurance and enhancement.
